

DVA

As a follow on from the DVA section in the last edition of Fire Board. I am reliably informed that a Gold Card can be obtained with less than 100 points, directly related to a condition. This is via a "Lifestyle Rating"

<u>D2670 Lifestyle Rating (dva.gov.au)</u> this is the link to the full 7 page document. Below if just the first few millimetres of the first column.



You have applied for a Disability Pension or Permanent Impairment compensation, or for an increase in your Disability Pension or Permanent Impairment compensation. In order to process your claim, we need to know your lifestyle rating.

Your lifestyle rating is based on the effects of your accepted or newly claimed disabilities on four aspects of your lifestyle.

These aspects are:

- · personal relationships;
- mobility;
- · recreational and community activities; and
- domestic and employment activities.

You can choose the method by which your lifestyle rating is worked out.

The three methods are described below and are called Option 1, Option 2 and Option 3.

Choose only one of these.

Note: If you are applying for, or might be considered for, Extreme Disablement Adjustment you may be asked to complete a "Lifestyle Questionnaire".

Do you remember "The Dent" in the hanger at Point Cook. My thanks to members of the FB page "RAAF Point Cook – history"

It was 11th of September 1914 -Tommy White in the first Box Kite CFS-3, the hangar was the 1914 Aeroplane Workshops now building 95.

I automatically reached for my RAAF aircraft book only to draw a blank. Then realised this pre-dates the RAAF and was flown by the Australian Flying Corps.

Matthew Flinders (1774 – 1814) - Navigator

Flinders proved that Van Dieman's Land (Tasmania) was an island (with George Bass) and was first to circumnavigation Australia and the first to use the name Australia.

For someone who dedicated his life to finding, navigating and mapping things, it was unfortunate that Matthew Flinders' body was lost for the better part of 200 years.

Archaeologists announced in 2019 they had rediscovered the grave of the first man known to have circumnavigated Australia, while digging under a park behind London's Euston station during excavations for the HS2 high-speed rail line. His coffin was identified by its well-preserved lead coffin plate.

His remains were interred on 13 July 2024 in the parish church of Donington, Lincolnshire, Flinders' birthplace.



Salmon Ponds at Plenty

If you are touring at all, 45min from Wrest Point are the Salmon Ponds at Plenty. Established in 1864 with the first salmon eggs arriving in May along with a small quantity of trout eggs. The young salmon were released into the Derwent River to run out to see and were expected to return as they do in Northen Hemisphere rivers. This however did not occur. The almost after thought of including a few trout eggs paid massive dividends with the fish stock breed at Plenty used to establish hatcheries around Australia & New Zealand.

Set in an English style garden and arboretum that surround the ponds along with a museum of trout fishing this is a very relaxing place to visit. A river walk complete with platypus if you're lucky and a café complete a great place to visit. For me the best thing on the entire site is the fish food dispenser. It is a genius idea as the fish must be fed, so why not get the visitors to pay for the feed. I am only too willing to lighten my pocket of saved \$2 coins to watch the water boil with fish when pellets hit the water. Make sure you draw the attention of a friend to something straight down from the edge of the Tiger Trout Pond, then lob in a few pellets. Tiger Trout make the biggest splashes.



Call for nominations: Japan-Australia Grassroots Exchange Program 2025

The Japan-Australia Grassroots Exchange Program, which commenced in 1994 as the Hand of Friendship project, is an initiative of RSL Australia that aims to foster mutual understanding of the peoples of Japan and Australia by inviting descendants of Australian Prisoners of War (POWs) to Japan through the RSL network.

The Japanese Government has offered two places for descendants of POWs to participate in the 2025 Grassroots Exchange Program. Participants will have an opportunity to promote post-war reconciliation, understanding, and goodwill between both countries.

Tour Information:

- Scheduled tentatively for February/ March 2025, the tour duration will be approximately 7 nights and 8 days in Japan.
- The Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs will cover flights, shared accommodation, domestic travel within Japan, meal allowance for lunches and dinners, and travel insurance.
- Participants are responsible for their travel expenses to and from the nearest airport to their residence, passport costs, expenses incurred above room charges, and meals exceeding the allowance, souvenirs, and personal incidentals.
- An interpreter and tour guide will accompany the participants. Activities
 will include meetings with various Government representatives and
 students, a dinner hosted by the Foreign Ministry, a visit to the
 Commonwealth War Cemetery, and sightseeing ventures.
- Final details will be available closer to the tour's commencement upon announcement of participants.

- A completed <u>nomination form</u>
- A passport size photo
- Supporting documents that briefly explain your connection to a POW, your interest in the Program, your place of residence, and your employment history.

Nominations will be reviewed and shortlisted by the RSL NSW Selections Committee and referred to RSL Australia for consideration. The NSW nominee and back-up nominee will be informed via email.
